- 1. CALL TO ORDER: Mayor Norby called the Special Meeting of the Sidney City Council to order at 6:30pm.
- 2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: The Pledge of Allegiance was stated by all present.
- 3. ALDERMEN PRESENT: Sergent, Rasmussen, Koffler, Gartner, Smith, and Christensen
- 4. Visitors: Nick Kallem, Jason Schrader
- 5. Public Hearing-Fiscal Year 2019-20 Budget: Mayor Norby opened the public hearing on the Fiscal Year 2019-20 budget at 6:30pm. Mayor Norby called for any proponents three times, and none came forward. Mayor Norby called for any opponents three times, and none came forward. With no questions, concerns, or testimony on the Fiscal Year 2019-20 budget, Mayor Norby closed the public hearing at 6:31pm.

6. Budget Resolutions:

- a. Resolution No. 3807-Assessing a property tax to defray the cost of collecting, removing, and disposing of garbage: Motion was made to approve Resolution 3807 by Alderwoman Christensen, and Alderwoman Sergent seconded the motion. Mr. Schrader asked if people put garbage next to the can, will it be picked up, and PWD Hintz stated it depends on the type of garbage. With no further discussion, all present voted aye.
- b. Resolution No. 3808-Assessing a property tax to defray the cost of maintaining and furnishing street lighting-residential: Motion was made to approve Resolution 3808 by Alderman Koffler and Alderwoman Rasmussen seconded the motion. With no discussion or questions, all present voted aye.
- c. Resolution No. 3809-Assessing a property tax to defray the cost of maintaining and furnishing street lighting-commercial: Motion was made to approve Resolution 3809 by Alderwoman Rasmussen and Alderman Smith seconded the motion. With no discussion or questions, all present voted aye.

Mr. Schrader asked what this is specifically, and City Clerk/Treasurer Redfield stated this is for mowing charges should the property owner not respond to warnings. - g. Resolution No. 3813-Assessing a property tax to defray the cost of maintaining South Meadow Village Park: Motion was made to approve Resolution 3813 by Alderwoman Rasmussen, and Alderman Koffler seconded the motion. With no discussion or questions, all present voted aye.
- h. Resolution No. 3814-Assessing a property tax against lots, parcels, or real estate for delinquent sewer: Motion was made to approve Resolution 3814 by Alderman Smith, and Alderman Gartner seconded the motion. With no discussion or questions, all present voted aye.
