# February 2, 2015

- CALL TO ORDER: The regular meeting of the Sidney City Council was called to order by Mayor Rick Norby at 6:30 pm.
- 2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: The pledge of allegiance was stated by all present.
- 3. ALDERMEN PRESENT: Sergent, Gilbert, Koffler, Gartner, Smith, Christensen
- 4. **CORRECTION OR APPROVAL OF MINUTES:** 
  - January 20, 2014: Motion was made to approve the minutes from the regular January 20, 2014 was made Alderwoman Sergent, and seconded by Alderwoman Christensen. All council present voted aye.
- **VISITORS:** 
  - TBID: Bryce: Did not attend the meeting.
  - Richard Dahl: Curb Stop: Mr. Dahl attended the regular meeting to discuss his curb stop valve fail at 1201 11th St SW and the bill from Franz construction for the fixing of it. After discussion with Utilities Manager Greg Anderson and the Council it was decided by General Consensus of the council to have the Mr. Dahl meet with the Water and Sewer Committee to discuss this topic in detail and make a recommendation to the Council.

# **PUBLIC HEARING:**

Annexation of Augustus Vaux II: The public hearing for the Annexation of Augustus Vaux II was called to order by Mayor Norby at 6:39 pm. City Planner How stated that this is for Lot 6 of Block B in the Richfield Addition for the Kum & Go. He also stated that he has not received any comments on this annexation. - CIP Committee: Proposals for CIP: Alderwoman Christensen stated that the CIP Committee met and reviewed the proposals submitted for the Sidney CIP. Alderwoman Christensen stated it was the recommendation in the form of a motion to accept Murtagh Municipal Engineering for the Sidney CIP project, and Alderman Smith seconded the motion. - 11. NEW BUSINESS: Nothing
- 12. CITY PLANNER HOW:
  - Resolution of Final Annexation Lot 6 Richfield Subdivision, Augustus Vaux II Annexation Amended: City Planner How stated the resolution will follow under City Attorney Navratil, and that this is amending the conditions of annexation of Augustus Vaux II to include Lot 6.
  - Resolution of Intent to Annex 3 Exempt Parcels: Tabled to Unfinished Business for the February 17, 2015
  - Extension of Preliminary Plat Wilkinson Phase II Subdivision, Lots 13A&B and 14A&B: City Planner How stated that the Wilkinson Phase II Subdivision is owned by Kerry Angelo by the golf course. The Preliminary Plat expired on January 6<sup>th</sup>, 2015, and City Planner How received the extension request letter on January 7<sup>th</sup>, 2015. City Planner How stated that this is the property that the city had complaints about liens and bills not being paid. He also stated that he checked with the County Treasurer who stated that there is still liens on the property. All liens would have to be paid within the 1 year extension before Final Plat would be approved. Alderman Smith asked why they were requesting the 1 year extension, and City Planner How stated that they have minor bills that still need to be paid. Motion was made to approve the 1 year extension of the preliminary plat of the Wilkinson Phase II Subdivision was made by Alderwoman Christensen and seconded by Alderman Smith. Alderman Smith asked how many liens are still on the property, and City Planner How stated that he does not know the number or the amount owed. Alderwoman Gilbert inquired if the entire process of the preliminary plat approval would have to be repeated if not extended and if this would include impact fees. City Planner How stated that the plat fees and review fees would have to be paid again and the preliminary plat submitted for approval. Utilities Manager Anderson stated that the original plat does stand, so he can sell the property as duplexes, but the final plat has to be approved before he can sell them individually as townhomes. All council present voted nay on the 1 year extension of the preliminary plat of the Wilkinson Phase II Sub.
  - SIA Extension Approval for Sunrise Village Subdivision, Phase 1: City Planner How stated that this was just defining condition number 3 that was given to the Sunrise Village to have completed in the SIA Extension. The City had Murtagh Municipal Engineering look at the water mains, and they stated that there is no need to complete the Miller Street Water Main extension until the start of Phase 2. The City Council attempted to reach Abigail St. Lawrence, Attorney for Sunrise Village, via phone, with no answer. The City Council contacted Tom Flately, Developer of Sunrise Village, via phone. City Planner How informed Mr. Flately that the City will not require the Miller Street Water Main extension until the beginning of phase 2, and that City Attorney Navratil will provide a letter for the No Sell Agreement. The extension stands until October 2015. City Attorney Navratil stated that the only condition left to be satisfied is the access on 4th or 6th. Motion was made to approve the SIA extension with the conditions that the no sell agreement is signed and to approve the satisfaction of condition number 3 by Alderwoman Christensen and seconded by Alderman Koffler. All council present voted aye.
  - Amended Plat- Franz and Sidney Public Schools: Tabled until Final Signatures collected.

# 13. CITY ATTORNEY NAVRATIL:

  Chief DiFonzo stated that there has been developments in the Sage Court Townhouse Project, or the employee housing project between the City and County. Paul Groshart, Richland County Housing Authority, informed the Council that the County Attorney recommended that the LLLP not be continued, instead the County will have no ownership and just loan the funds necessary to the RCHA for the project, and once the project is done the City would have to deed the land to the RCHA as the land and the buildings have to be in the same ownership name. RCHA will assume all liability of the townhouses and the project as they will be the owners. Chief DiFonzo stated that he would recommend moving forward with the new plan and not the LLLP. Ö.
